LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends,

What a great first full year you have made it for Friends of Aseema!

This year began with local press coverage on our beginnings and our exclusive mission to support Aseema Charitable Trust. Aseema provides high-quality, valuebased education and medical care to thousands of extremely marginalized slum children in Mumbai, and in a remote tribal region called Igatpuri.

In February, Board Member Robin Tom and I went to Mumbai to visit the schools run by Aseema. During our visit, we not only had the opportunity to strengthen connections with staff and leadership, but also spoke with Aseema students and alumni. You can find some of these videos on the <u>testimonials page</u> of our website.

We officially obtained our 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status from the IRS in March, affirming that donations may be tax deductible. On top of that, our creative and hardworking volunteer team began to grow our presence on social media to help broaden awareness efforts.

Then came COVID-19...

In Mumbai,

things grew dire. The Indian government, on short notice, ordered a lockdown to slow the viral spread, which cut off students from school meals and their families from daily wages. And, when they needed us most, I worried that our organization's efforts would be impaired by economic uncertainty and the inability to meet with donors.

But I needn't have worried because YOU helped Aseema distribute several rounds of emergency food rations to nearly 10,000 people!

How? We operate through a grantmaking process. Aseema makes grant requests that are reviewed by our independent board of directors. This means that, while we cannot take earmarked donations, it gives us a special strength: your donations address Aseema's greatest needs.

Running schools requires students, equipment, buildings, staff, and administration. We are able to provide financial support for items like smart phones for remote learning but also for teacher and staff salaries, classically difficult expenses to raise funds for but expenses that are vital.

Beginning in March, a government-ordered lockdown closed schools and businesses. Many students rely on Aseema's mid-day meals for nutrition and now their families were unable to earn even their meager day-labor wages. Aseema immediately moved to <u>master the logistics</u> of distributing ration kits to its children and their families—it would not be an easy OR inexpensive task. While Aseema social workers first identified 600 people with the most urgent needs, they soon realized that all of the families would quickly go hungry. With its first round of food distribution, Aseema reached more than 9,980 people. Aseema has conducted four additional rounds of food distribution since then.

DONATIONS SUPPORTED: REMOTE LEARNING



Aseema broke new ground this year when it was rapidly forced to determine how to engage in distance learning when all of their children live in slum communities and rural Igatpuri. This required funds to support teachers and staff preparing to teach, distribute learning materials, and provide children with smart phones and data plans. Many teachers who needed to soon lead remote classes did not have laptops, nor did older students studying for the SSC tests, India's notoriously difficult school exit exams.

DONATIONS SUPPORTED: EDUCATION



In India, when a child finishes the 10th standard (roughly 10th grade), the child must take the **SSC exams**. It is difficult and can be life-determining. This year, when the results came in from the last round of exams, **ALL of the Aseema** students had passed!

This would be an achievement for any school but is all the more impressive because Aseema's students had been living all the while in extreme poverty.
